GOVERNMENT OF ODISHA IN PARTNERSHIP WITH ZHL LAUNCHES BOAT AMBULANCES FOR REMOTE RIVERSIDE VILLAGES.

Waterborne diseases are common in the riverside villages, and villagers have to often travel 20 km to reach a health center. On March 5, 2019, a Boat Ambulance Service was launched to facilitate ease in accessing health care services for the people living in villages near Bhitarkanika National Park in Kendrapara district. It is meant to ferry people to hospitals and clinics in case of emergency.
